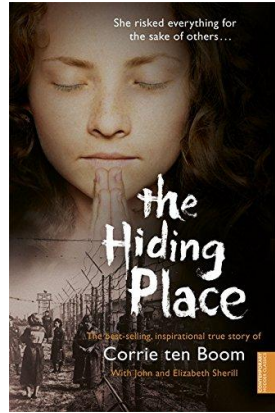

A Good Read.....

Recently I decided to revisit a classic book I had first read as a very new Christian back in my youth, namely "The Hiding Place" by Corrie ten Boom. And I am so glad I did!

The book is her recollections of life in a watchmaker's family in Holland. As the Nazi madness swept across Europe this family, prompted by their love for Jesus, risked all for the sake of others by offering shelter to persecuted Jews. Corrie is a great story teller. Through her experiences she shares with the reader the truth and wisdom she found, and does it in such a way as to throw light on the problems and decisions in life today. As she says.....

"Every experience God give us, every person He puts in our lives is the perfect preparation for the future that only He can see."

We read how she discovered the Father's deep love, how she grew to pray and trust God for every need and how she learned to give thanks in every situation. This is a person who described herself as a "very weak and ordinary one", who saw the worst that humanity is capable of, yet held on to faith, hope, joy and love, even in the horror of a concentration camp.

A truly inspiring read, and seems timely as we come up to Remembrance Sunday – my copy is available to borrow!
